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### "MERRY CHRISTMAS!" CELERRATING WITH CHRYSOSTOM

St. John Chrysostom was Archbishop of Constantinople in the 4th century.

A prolific author, he has given us countless letters, the Divine Liturgy we celebrate every Sunday and sermons, such as the one below on the Great Feast of Christmas.

The Church honours his memory every year on January 27th and November 13th.

"I behold a new and wondrous mystery! My ears resound to the shepherd's song, piping no soft melody, but loudly chanting a heavenly hymn! The angels sing! The archangels blend their voices in harmony! The cherubim resound their joyful praise!

The Seraphim exalt His glory! All join to praise this holy feast. He who is above now, for our salvation, dwells here below; and we, who were lowly, are exalted by divine mercy! Today Bethlehem resembles heaven, hearing from the stars the singing of angelic voices and, in place of the sun, witnessing the rising of the Sun of Justice!

Ask not how this is accomplished, for where God wills, the order of nature is overturned. For He willed He had the powers He descended. He saved. All things move in obedience to God.



And so the kings have come, and they have seen the heavenly King that has come upon the earth, not bringing with Him angels, nor archangels, nor thrones, nor dominions, nor powers, nor principalities, but, treading a new and solitary path, He has come forth from a spotless womb. Yet He has not forsaken His angels, nor left them deprived of His care, nor because of His incarnation has He ceased being God. And behold kings have come, that they might serve the Leader of the Hosts of Heaven; Women, that they might adore Him Who was born of a woman so that He might change the pains of childbirth into joy; Virgins, to the Son of the Virgin.... Infants, that they may adore Him who became a little child, so that out of the mouths of infants He might perfect praise; Children,

## Preparing for Christmas By Dr. Maria-Fotini Polidoulis Kapsalis

If your family is like mine, there are a lot of preparations that need to be done to prepare for Christmas: the house gets a good cleaning, the outside lights are put up, the tree is decorated, stockings are hung, and festive tablecloths and centerpieces get placed on the tables. Christmas cards are written, and let us not forget the letter to Santa, and all are mailed to family and friends. Add to our list gift buying, wrapping, ribbons, bows and labels, and we are almost done. The turkey is purchased for Christmas dinner, and all the ingredients that go into making a very special meal. It seems that we are now ready for Christmas. But we are far from it.



Often times we worry so much about the things on the "outside" that we need to do to prepare for Christmas that we forget about the things that need to be done on the "inside". And by the inside, I mean, have we prepared our hearts? How can we welcome Jesus into our hearts if we haven't cleaned there? But you might ask, how does one prepare a heart? St. John the Baptist prepared us for the coming of Jesus by calling out, "Repent and make straight the way of the Lord." What does it mean to repent?

Repent means to own our mistakes, admit that we make them, and feel sorry for them. But repentance also means making an effort to change our behaviour so we don't make the same mistakes again. And as Orthodox Christians we go to Confession to an Orthodox priest to confess our sins, and ask for guidance that will help us change our behaviour and our lives. This is how we clean our hearts in the Sacrament of Confession. And after we cleaned up in there, we can begin all the other preparations of the heart. Remembering and reaching out to people, but not just to our family and friends, but also to strangers, and especially to the poor. This year, prepare for Christmas on the inside as well as on the outside, because then our Lord will come into our homes and our hearts, and truly bless us.

to the Child who raised up martyrs through the rage of Herod; Men, to Him who became man that He might heal the miseries of His servants; Shepherds, to the Good Shepherd who was laid down His life for His sheep; Priests, to Him who has become a High Priest according to the order of Melchizedek; Servants, to Him who took upon Himself the form of a servant, that He might bless our stewardship with the reward of freedom (Philippians 2:7); Fishermen, to the Fisher of humanity; Publicans, to Him who from among them named a chosen evangelist; Sinful women, to Him who exposed His feet to the tears of the repentant woman;



And that I may embrace them all together, all sinners have come, that they may look upon the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world!

I hold in my arms the cradle of Christ! For this is all my hope! This is my life! This is my salvation! And bearing it I come, and having from its power received the gift of speech, I too, with the angels and shepherds, sing: "Glory to God in the Highest, and on earth peace to men of good will!"
