## LET'S CELEBRATE! FEAST OF ST. DEMETRIOS THE GREAT MARTYR

As a member of this parish for years, it's always a special time of year when October 26th approaches. The feastday of St. Demetrios the Great Martyr is one that is anticipated by countless faithful all across the globe, from Thessaloniki) to Toronto. Thessaloniki, Greece is the city where St. Demetrios suffered martyrdom, sacrificing his life for Christ in a time of persecution. Toronto, on the other hand, has a special bond with St. Demetrios, as he was the third saint to be honoured with a Church in the city (after St. George and the Theotokos and Ever-Virgin Mary). There are countless baptisms, weddings, first communions, funerals, along with other sacraments and services, that have taken place in the Church – a Church that was built because of the Greek



Orthodox Christians of Toronto and vicinity coming together to honour the Myrrh-Streamer and Great Martyr.

All year long, but especially on his feastday of October 26<sup>th</sup>, we remember his conviction and faith in Christ. He emulated St. Paul's words: he no longer lived for himself, but Christ lived in him (cf. Gal. 2:20). His witness for the Truth continues to provide an example for us all – showing our love for God and to hold Him first in our lives. Together with St. Nestor the Martyr, he has provided this example of witness to Orthodox Christians who honour him in so many ways.

One can say the most important way to honour St. Demetrios the Great Martyr would be to attend the divine services celebrating his memory. As every year, **Great Vespers** will be held on the eve of the feast (October 25th, 7:00 to 8:30 p.m.). Leading us in our celebrations will be our Metropolitan, His Eminence Sotirios of Toronto (Canada), together with all the clergy of Toronto and vicinity. The next day, October 26th, the morning services of Matins and Divine Liturgy will be held, once again led



by His Eminence. The opportunity to receive Holy Communion is definitely the high point in any way of celebrating his feast, since uniting with our Lord Jesus Christ was St. Demetrios' goal in life.

These liturgical celebrations are important for all of us to honour our Saint. Truly, if we do not honour our saints by coming to Church, can we really say we *honour* them in the way they deserve to be honoured? Praying together as a spiritual family honours the Saint, while at the same time praising our Lord God who graced us with saints to serve as our examples.

Something else we can do to honour his memory would be to participate in that which he was so passionate about: Sunday School and Catechism. He was a teacher of the Faith for the people in his hometown and brought many to Christ. We should do the same with our children – and even ourselves – with our children attending Sunday School and our youth, young adults and families attending the Re-Catechism sessions we offer. In this way, we can learn about Christ and His wonders continually.

Furthermore, as Christians, we should never be weary in showing compassion whenever we can. They could include people who are destitute financially, spiritually or otherwise. It could include organizations who help out in the community (especially within our Church, like the Philoptochos, Council, etc.). Philanthropy is always a way to show that freely we have received from God, freely we give back to His people (cf. Mth. 10:8).
