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
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MESSAGE FOR THE NEW ECCLESIASTICAL YEAR:

ON THIS LIFE AND THE NEXT

With summer coming to a close and students going back to their classrooms, the Orthodox Church celebrates the "Feast of the Indiction", otherwise known as the beginning of the ecclesiastical year. Every September 1st, the Gospel reading prepares all people for the coming year which will no doubt be filled with joys and sorrows, blessings and difficulties.

We hear when Jesus entered Nazareth and preached by quoting the words of the Prophet Isaiah (61:1-2) which foretold the coming of the Messiah:



The Spirit of the Lord is upon Me, because He has anointed Me to preach the gospel to the poor; He has sent Me to heal the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed; to proclaim the acceptable year of the Lord." (Lk. 4:18-19).

The Spirit of the Lord is indeed upon all of humanity, with so many blessings bestowed upon us. In his letter, His All Holiness Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew I speaks to us of the blessing many of us forget about: creation itself.

Our God created the universe and formed the earth as a perfect dwelling place for humanity. The world that surrounds us was thus offered to us as a gift by our Creator as an arena of social activity but also of spiritual sanctification in order that we might inherit the creation to be renewed in the future age.

This message is not merely to promote an "environmentally-friendly message" within the Orthodox world; rather, it is to admit that we are responsible to keep well the blessings given by God to humanity, along with repenting for our sins. His All Holiness continues:

In praying for the natural environment, we are praying for personal repentance for our contribution - smaller or greater - to the disfigurement and destruction of creation, which we collectively experience regionally and occasionally through the immense phenomena of our time.

In his Indiction message, His Eminence Metropolitan Sotirios of Toronto (Canada) expounds the topic of repentance further by reminding us that, '[While] all of us live on earth, we should think of heaven. For, truly, "here we do not have an enduring city, but we seek the city that is to come."'

A Message from our Priest & Sunday School Director

All of us in Canada pay particular attention to the education of our children. We send them to school; we hire tutors and do everything in our power to prepare them for a better future in our society. All this is good and beneficial, but as humans we are not just flesh and bones. We are also spirit. Our souls need nourishment as well, as is said in Deuteronomy 8:3: "Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God." You will not find that type of education in any Canadian school. That is what we offer at St. Demetrios Greek Orthodox Sunday School.

We teach our children the Orthodox faith, our Sacraments, to love God and respect people, to be part of the big picture of being Greek and Orthodox. When, God willing, the time comes to step into society, along with the secular knowledge and education, they are prepared to defend their faith and protect their spirit. If not, they get lost in a Godless society, unprotected and easy prey to heretics.

Our children have only one opportunity in life to get this spiritual education. If they miss it, tomorrow might be too late. No one will ever consider skipping even one year of school; yet when it comes to spiritual education, we neglect it.

The entire Sunday School team – Fr. Konstantinos, our spiritual counsellor; Mr. Basile Polidoulis, the director; and all the teachers – are doing our part to give this education to our children. We are calling upon you to do your part, to enrol the children to Sunday School and to bring them every Sunday to St. Demetrios Church.

Remember that secular education is good, but not enough. Christ said: "For what does it profit a man if he gains the whole world and loses his own soul?" (Mark 8:36)

If you wish, we invite you to come in and participate one Sunday in one of the classes, to get a first-hand experience of what Sunday School is all about.


