# Χριστός Ανέστη! Christ is risen!

As we open an Orthodox Christian calendar, we find that all our Sundays are centred around the Great Feast of Pascha. As we enter into the Pascha of our Lord, we enter into a passage from death to Life. This is the Key to the liturgical year of the Church. dox spirituality is Paschal in its inner context, and the real content of the Christian life is joy. According to one of the greatest liturgical theologians of the 20th century, Fr. Alexander Schmemman, "Pascha is the real beginning of the liturgical year...because

When dealing with children, the only thing a child accepts easily is joy. Christ tells us we should be just like them, when we hear, "whoever does not receive the Kingdom of God like a child shall not enter it." (cf. Mark 10:15, Luke 18:17) To become like a child, according to Christ, means to be capable of that joy to enter into communion with nature, with other people, without suspicion or fear or frustration. # JESUS CHRIST— SON OF GOD, SAVIOUR OF THE WORLD

During the forty days of Pascha, the Church celebrates the Resurrection of Christ. The Sundays during Pascha instruct the faithful that Jesus Christ is the Son of God, the Saviour of the world.

On **Thomas Sunday**, we remember Jesus breathing on the disciples and saying to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit! If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven...." We also remember how He revealed Himself to Thomas, after Thomas doubted the Resurrection. We see that Christ is the Saviour of the world in that He rose from the dead and was able to appear to His disciples in a miraculous way.



On the **Sunday of the Myrrhbearing Women**, we remember how Jesus rose from the dead as the Myrrhbearing women were prepared to anoint His body with spices. This Sunday reminds us that Jesus was Perfect Man (that He suffered as we suffer, and He died as we die) and Perfect God (that He rose from the dead and was not subject to corruption).



On the **Sunday of the Paralytic**, we remember Jesus' miracle of raising a paralytic up and helping Him walk again! More than this, He showed the paralyzed man that He was the Messiah, the Son of God. The gospel reading shows us that, as God, Jesus can heal bodily and spiritual illnesses and invites everyone to have a relationship with Him.



On the **Sunday of the Samaritan Woman**, we remember Jesus' discussion with a woman of Samaria. She was a woman who lived sinfully. Yet, Jesus did not judge her and put her on the right path towards salvation. St. Photini, the Samaritan Woman, is an example for all of us — it's never too late to ask forgiveness and have a relationship with Christ.



On the **Sunday of the Blind Man**, we remember Jesus how Jesus healed the blind man from his illness. We are taught that people are never ill because God "punishes them". Jesus answers His disciples as to why people are ill: "that the works of God might be made manifest" (or, that God might be glorified). Every person has the opportunity to glorify God—it's up to us to glorify Him and praise Him, even if life is difficult.

Once again, St. Demetrios Greek Orthodox Church led the way by hosting the most successful Youth Retreat throughout the Metropolis of Canada! With over 300 children and youth, who enjoyed over 700 crafts and an abundant Lenten lunch, our Retreat was truly a community effort for this day to be as successful as it was! Many of you pre-registered your donations in kind and your availability to volunteer and still many more just showed up, rolled up their sleeves and took on any available task! For all of you, we are very grateful!!!

Along with our thanks, we would also like to take this opportunity to inform you of a few things. It was originally communicated that a contribution of \$2 per child would be requested at the door in order to help cover the costs of our retreat. However, the night before the retreat, we received a phone call informing us that an anonymous Sponsor had come forward and was interested in donating the entire costs of the retreat. Their only stipulation was that the money collected at the door be forwarded as a donation to the Greek Community and not held by the Sunday school. This very generous Sponsor covered all the costs for the crafts and also supplied 160 drinks, lollipops for every child and all the lettuce, bananas and grapes in the luncheon. The Sponsor has asked to remain anonymous but we all wish him good health and God's blessings! Along with this Sponsor, many parents donated the balance of the food for the luncheon, as well as the Philoptochos who made many pans of *Kritharaki*. These acts of generosity showed how our community came together in an impressive example of "Giving to our neighbour, Giving for Christ." That was our theme for this year's retreat and we are very proud to be a part of such a generous community!
